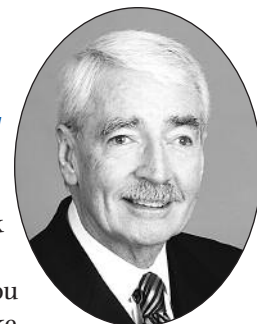

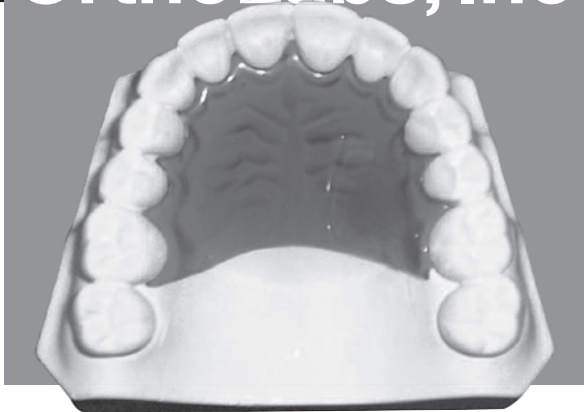

The meticulous performance of the different clinical steps during restorative work such as tooth preparation, provisionalization, impression taking, try-in, and final cementation will be elaborated, leading to more predictability and longevity in esthetics. Pertinent clinical details are presented which can be built into your own treatment concepts and utilized tomorrow. The objectives of this seminar are as follows: Present a refined clinical treatment concept for long lasting anterior crowns • Understand the nature and behavior of the collagen fibre bundles • Use the physiologic tooth mobility for precise crown cementation. Dr. Kopp received his dental degree in 1975 from the University of Basel School of Dentistry, Switzerland, where he started his postgraduate training in Operative Dentistry and Periodontics. He also completed postgraduate programs in Fixed and Removable Prosthodontics. Since 1984, he has maintained a private practice for Perio-Prosthodontics in Zurich. As of 5/18/11, there is a Business checking account balance of \$44,529.50, a Business (GKAS) checking account balance of \$13,358.34, and a money market account balance of \$42,291.25 for a total of \$100,173.09. This total does not include \$10,000 from DKU. We surpassed our projected dues income. Once all deposits are made, we are about \$20,500 over-budgeted for this FY2010-11.

IRS update: All penalties have been paid. Our legal fees for the audit were \$8,304, but our attorneys only elected to bill us \$1,000 for their services. A thank you letter will be sent. Our annual Non-For-Profit status renewal, as well as By-Laws changes, will need to be sent to the state after the installation of new officers. These will be submitted with our tax return.

Three of our Newest Members were welcomed and honored at our March General Meeting: Drs. Long Mugianto, Mary Jo Massaro, and Carolyn Kelly. A special thank you to Dr. Allen Yang for a great introduction to our local society for these members, and for the special gifts presented! Dr. Paul Goodman shared excellent recommendations on implant treatment planning and patient case presentation. Paul's energetic, engaging manner was enjoyed by everyone in attendance!

The April New Dentist Event at McKenzie's was a blast! Lots of networking took place as we enjoyed great food and libations. Thank you to everyone who participated, and to Drs. Allen Yang and Angela Wimer for planning the evening! We are looking forward to our next event!

Dr. Barry Cohen hosted our **May 2011 GKAS event** – thank you, Barry! Eight volunteer dentists and their staff provided over \$5,000 of dental care and education to 14 indigent children. **Our next event will be in Broomall in October** at the office of Dr. Theresa Devine.

From 3/3/2011 to 5/11/2011 the answering service received 29 calls.

Four calls were for general or specialty referrals, 3 calls were for Reduced Fee/Free Clinics, 5 calls for dental questions, 2 calls for DKU, 1 call for CPR, 1 call for Member List, 1 call for Speaker, 1 call for associateship, 1 call for a complaint, 1 call for an address change, 2 calls were wrong numbers, 3 calls were sales calls and 4 calls were hang ups.

Dr. Scanlon sent 62 letters to non-renewing members.

The *Bulletin* will continue to use Archway press. The USPS did not raise rates for "standard (bulk) mail" this year - only postcards, no need to increase our budget for postage. The next increase will likely be April 2012.

We are still interested in contacting any dentist that you may know that could provide homebound dentistry. Please let Dr. Tami Brady know if you know someone who does nursing home visits.

There is a SE PA Oral Health Task Force meeting 5/19 at Kids Smiles, Dr. Logan will be attending this meeting.

We had a local 3rd grade student from Sugartown Elementary School receive Honorable Mention for her poster in the NCDH month poster contest, Nicole Karowski.

As of Feb. 28, there is a DKU checking account balance of \$7,609.49 and a money market account balance of \$35,556.89 for a total of \$45,166.38. There are still about \$8,000 in expenses yet to be paid for the May course. \$10,000 will be turned over to the Society. The 2011-12 course line-up was presented. DKU is doing well with sponsorship. Please contact Dr. Cohen if you know of any additional table sponsors. There was discussion of offering new (never before) 2nd District members a 50% discount on the DKU registration series. Dr. Yang will forward a list of these members to Dr. Cohen.

Non-Covered Services: Sen. Kim Ward (R-Westmoreland) has reintroduced legislation that would prohibit insurance companies from capping dental services they do not cover under their plans. In the House, Rep. Thomas Murt (R-Montgomery) has also introduced

identical legislation, with the bill number being HB 1537. HB 1537 has ten sponsors and has been referred to the House Insurance committee for consideration.

General Anesthesia Insurance Coverage for At-Risk Patients: On May 11, PDA testified before the House Insurance Committee in support of HB 532, legislation requiring insurers to cover under their medical policies the cost of administering general anesthesia when needed to provide dental treatment to children seven years of age and younger and special needs patients of any age. PDA continues to lobby the Insurance Committee members to vote the bill out of committee to the House floor. Meanwhile, preparations are underway for PDA's press conference on HB 532, during Day on the Hill on June 14.

Assignment-of-Benefits: Rep. Thomas Murt has reintroduced legislation that would require insurance companies to assign benefits to the treating dentist when he or she is not a participating provider with a patient's insurance plan. The bill number for this legislation is HB 1536 and has been referred to the House Insurance committee.

Requiring Dentists to Carry Malpractice Insurance: Due to a pending lawsuit against a dentist practicing without liability insurance, there is momentum in the General Assembly to pass legislation requiring all dentists to carry this type of coverage. Sen. Patricia Vance (R-Cumberland) introduced SB 388, legislation that would require all licensees to carry a specified amount of coverage. This bill has seven sponsors and was introduced in the Senate Banking and Insurance Committee in February, where it has not received any consideration to date.

Governor Corbett's proposed budget eliminates Medicaid coverage for dentures and other dental services, including crowns and periodontal services. Oral exams and cleanings will be limited to one visit each year. PDA is working with the Corbett Administration to preserve these benefits in the budget.

The PDA Annual Session was held April 8 and 9 in Hershey, PA. Outgoing President William Spruill was honored for his leadership and legislative initiatives. New President Dennis Charlton was inducted and will continue to guide the PDA forward guided by the initiatives raised by the House of Delegates. Among the resolutions passed was the creation of a Licensure Task Force to determine the feasibility of alternative licensure processes within Pennsylvania. This resolution was initially drafted by the ASDA delegation. Among resolutions passed whose goal is membership retention is the Bylaws change allowing the extension of dues payments to December 15 for participants in the electronic dues payment program. PDA's Access to Care Committee name was changed – to Access to Oral Health Committee. A full report of the actions of the House of Delegates will be published in the PDA Journal.

Most of the work of the PDA Board is now done online through the PDA Social Network and online voting. The decrease

in the number of Board Meetings and conference calls leads to substantial savings. Please feel free to contact me with any PDA relevant concerns/ suggestions at DrRon@adamember.net.

Dr. Weber presented some highlights from the last Board meeting in April, including a nomination to the ADA Council on Science that will be forwarded to the ADA HOD and acted upon in October. Congratulations to Dr. Thomas P. Sollecito from the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine.

The ADA has developed an interesting relationship with Sharecare (owned by Oprah, Dr. Oz and Sony Productions) to be the dental expert of their new health website. It will compete against WebMD. It will make the ADA more visible and contain a link. The ADA also entered into a MOU with the Dental Trade Alliance to participate in an ad campaign developed by the AD Council, a company that aids non-profits in developing ads for their promotion.

This will be a difficult year for the ADA budget and the HOD will be reminded that any additional programs must be funded through a dues increase. Please look carefully at any ADA programs that are not giving us the results we want. If you have any questions or suggestions, do not hesitate to contact me. I thank you all for your support and please keep me in mind when you see a potential candidate in your district for an ADA position. weberc@ada.org

Sara Stankiewicz will not be returning as Meeting Coordinator. Dr. Logan introduced a qualified applicant, Lauren Sands, who has meeting coordinating experience with other dental societies. She is an independent contractor, and will file her own 1099, which would meet IRS requirements. She is willing to work for us for \$20/hr. Our budget stipulates \$1,500/yr. Motion (Gordon; 2nd by Cohen) passed unanimously: to offer Lauren the Meeting Coordinator position with a salary cap of \$1,500/yr.

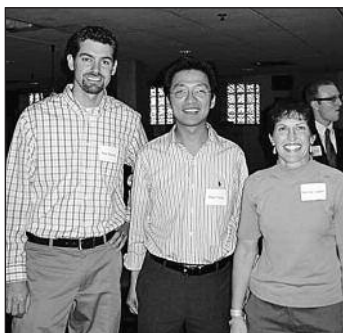
