Taking the mystique out of crown and bridge repair –

You can make it work!



Broken porcelain – what to do? Nothing lasts forever, our restorations wear out.

During any given day of dental practice, we face challenges in repairing and restoring teeth. With our patients keeping their teeth longer, we are seeing problems develop with the fracture of all-porcelain and porcelain-metal crown and bridge restorations. We hope it isn't the one that we did! During this course you will learn the ins and outs of predictable crown and bridge repair. At the completion of this program you will be ready to put this information to use in your dental practice.

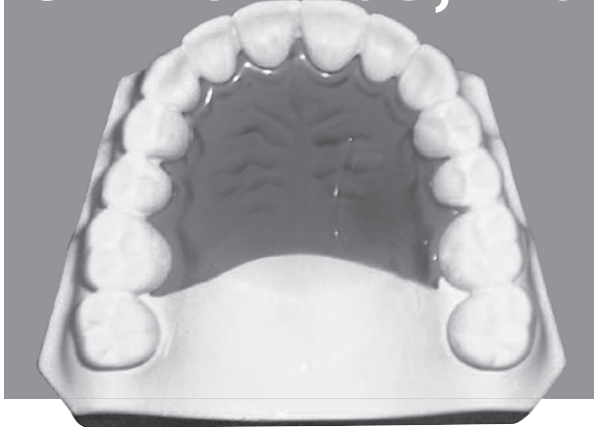

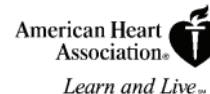

Our Second District PDA Trustee, Dr. Bernie Dishler highlighted topics to be discussed at the upcoming PDA Annual Session. These included the declining number of dentists and recent grads for the PDA to recruit members from, the PDA budget, and the recommendations of the PDA Governance Task Force. The GTF recommends restructuring the existing councils and committees into 4 committees: Advocacy, Member Value, Public Health, and Organizational Excellence. Committee appointments are based upon interest and expertise, such that each district may not be represented.

As of March 3, 2009, there is a checking account balance of \$35,463.70 and a money market account balance of \$27,111.90 for a total of \$62,575.60. Income is 108% of what was budgeted (dues are about 90% of what was budgeted – we have no associate members). Expenses are 79% of what was budgeted (about \$11,000 under budget).

Special thanks were extended to Dr. Rene Polis for designing and sending out the invitations to the new dentists for our March meeting; and to Dr. Ted McGurk for searching for and ordering the USB drives to be given as gifts.

From 12/24/08 to 2/26/09, the answering service received 20 calls and 2 emails. 16 calls were for general or specialty referrals, 1 was for Medicaid/key-stone dental referrals, 1 was for professional services or opportunities, 3 calls were complaints against dentists, and 1 call was unidentified or caller could not be reached.

Dr. Dave Iglewicz informed us that the NCDHM poster contest is still going on. About 24 have been received so far. The deadline for poster submission is March 12.

The next meeting of the Southeast Regional Oral Health Task Force is Wednesday, April 15, 1pm, at Kids Smiles. Anyone is welcome to attend!

As of February 25, 2009, there is a DKU checking account balance of \$27,465.98 and a money market account balance of \$52,224.15 for a total of \$79,690.13. From 7/1/08 to 2/25/09, DKU net income is \$47,692.69. There are still 3 major programs to pay for, but DKU should provide a check at the May meeting.

The PDA Council on Government Relations (CGR), in an attempt to make the Council more responsive to legislative needs, has formed two subcommittees. One subcommittee will deal with access related issues (i.e., fluoridation, scope of practice); and the second subcommittee will deal with insurance related issues. It is hoped that CGR will be able to respond quicker to legislative needs.

A number of legislative bills are currently being considered, one of which is Senate Bill 142. **SB 142** deals with some significant monetary penalties to permit holders (i.e. dentists) for infractions. The bill does not specify the type of infractions, but the monetary penalty can be up to \$10,000. Obviously, the PDA is opposing this bill and currently formulating its response.

PADPAC, with input from our lobbyist (the Winter Group), has approved a 2009 budget. Legislative re-election contributions have been approved up to a possible \$84,000 this calendar year. This will be spread among the leadership and individuals in both parties.

PADPAC currently has \$307,000 in its hard dollar account and \$87,000 in its soft dollar account. PADPAC hard dollar contributions are down approximately 30% from 2007. Soft dollar contributions are down approximately 37%. Currently, 30% of PDA membership from across the state contributes to PADPAC. Second District participation rate is 28%. There is no individual breakdown for Chester/Delaware.

The PA State Board of Dentistry (SBOD) has sent a letter of support for Dr. Ismail's CDHC (Community Dental Health Coordinator) pilot program with the following stipulations: there should be no more than 18 students enrolled in the next 5 years; there should be an oversight board with representation from SBOD, PDA, PADD, PDHA, and the PA Dental Assistants Association; and those who enroll should be dual trained as an EFDA or RDH.

The SBOD has approved language for a bill allowing "mutual recognition" of any US dental licensure board (NERB, CRTA, WREB, etc.) as acceptable for PA dental licensure.

The PA Licensing Board's Public Relations office will no longer print newsletters for any of the 27 PA licensing boards due to budgetary constraints. However, they will post one 1000-word articles, or two 500-word articles online annually.

Dr. Shelly has completed the Policy Manual. There are 16 different committees and positions describing responsibilities and duties. Dr. Himmelberger will now finalize the document. Contact Dr. Shelly for a copy of the updated Policy Manual.

A motion passed unanimously to send a recognition letter to Dr. Emanuel Ploumis' grandson (closest living relative) stating that "The Board of Governors of the Dental Society of Chester County and Delaware County recognize the contributions made by Dr. Emanuel Ploumis to dentistry and specifically to this Society as President. Further, this Board expressed its sincere condolences and sympathy to his grandson, and directs that this action be spread upon the minutes of the Society, and a copy be presented to his grandson in recognition of the dedication of his grandfather's beloved profession."

A list of the Society's 2009–2010 nominations for Officers, Board of Governors, 2nd District Officers and Directors, Trustee to the PDA, PDA Delegates, and PDA Alternate Delegates

was distributed. **A motion passed unanimously to approve the list as submitted by the Nominating Committee.**

A motion passed unanimously to approve the nomination of Dr. Bernie Logan for the Society's Recognition Award for her tireless service to our Society.

The alumni association of Temple University's Kornberg School of Dental Medicine has asked for sponsorship to support its White Coat Ceremony for 2nd-year dental students on May 8, 2009. Concern was expressed about sponsoring one of the PA dental schools and not the others. **A letter will be sent to the Kornberg SDM saying that we have considered their request, but will be referred to the PDA for their consideration since there are two other dental schools in PA which may request similar support.**

A motion was made but not seconded that an official audit of all our accounts, including our reserve account, our general operating account, and the DKU account, be conducted to assure that we

are following best accounting practices. It is written in the by-laws that an audit must be conducted, but does not say how often. Dr. Funari feels that the current accountant is very thorough about ensuring expenses/income are placed in the correct locations. All accounts are on QuickBooks. Concern was expressed about performing an audit now, without looking into the costs involved. **A motion then passed unanimously to table the discussion until the May Board Meeting, and appoint a committee to look at all of the aspects involved (including the by-laws, potential costs involved, and frequency of an audit).**

The President appointed a Task Force with Dr. Funari as chair to identify the necessary procedures to audit our accounts in fulfillment of the by-laws. Its other members include Drs. Cohen, Tami Brady, Tom Brady, and Cimino.

A motion was made that the treasurer, in concert with the executive committee, develop budgets over the next five years (2010 up to and including 2014) which include contributions to the reserve fund,

such that the reserve fund will be at least equal to \$50,000 at the end of those five years. Tabled until the May Meeting.

There will be a Mega-Issue discussion of the topic during the buffet dinner at the next Board Meeting to come up with some strategies for budgetary savings that can be presented at the next Budgetary Committee Meeting.

A motion passed unanimously for the Society to have a Call-a-Thon to contact and re-recruit the Society's non-renewing members, after obtaining a list of non-renewing members from the PDA. The date of the event will be determined once a list of non-renewing members is published (after March 31 at the earliest). Drs. Himmelberger and McGurk volunteered their office to host the event.

Drs. Bushick and Grabill would like to organize another Shredder Event in the fall. In the past, the cost to the Society was \$100/hr for 3 hours. They will research this project for updated fees and dates, and report back at the next meeting. ☺
