

# ADA PRINCIPLES of ETHICS & CODE of PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT


In 2016, the ADA celebrated the 150th Anniversary of the ADA Principles of Ethics & Code of Professional Conduct ("The ADA Code"), 150 years of *Putting Patients First*. It is a point of pride that the ADA was the first professional organization to adopt a code of ethics, well before our colleagues in medicine and nursing. As members of the ADA, we voluntarily agree to abide by the principles of The ADA Code. But what exactly is The ADA Code and how does it inform our practices?

Advisory Opinions. The Principles of Ethics describes the aspirational goals of the profession and consists of

five (5) fundamental principles: Patient Autonomy (Respect); Nonmaleficence (Do no harm); Beneficence (Do good); Justice (Fairness); and Veracity (Truthfulness).

As described in the Preamble, "the ethical dentist strives to do that which is right and good. The ADA Code is an instrument to help the dentist is this quest." In future articles, each of the Principles will be described in greater detail so that you have a better understanding of the

ethical framework for decision-making in our daily interactions with patients.



Medical emergencies occurring in the dental office can be stressful and frightening for both the patient and entire dental team. #### Where YOU Make a Difference

Community Volunteers in Medicine, CVIM, provides quality dental care in a modern facility located on Lawrence Drive in West Goshen Township, Chester County. CVIM's 7-operatory dental suite, two dental satellite locations, and extensive dental outreach programs provide comprehensive, general, and specialty dentistry, screenings, and treatments to more than 4,600 uninsured adults and children annually. All treatment is free to our patients and screened by our eligibility team to ensure they are truly in need so that we are helping those people who really deserve it.

Dozens of dentists volunteer their time and service to treat the uninsured, earning under 300 percent of the national poverty level, and living or working in and around Chester County. The goal of the dental team is to be able to provide complete dental care to each patient, and we have volunteers in most specialties, and dozens of general practitioners. Even though it sounds like a complete program, we are in need of additional general practice volunteers and dentists in all specialties. You can provide care as often as once a week, or less frequently, half, or full days. We have many dentists that volunteer once per month, or even every 6 weeks. If you can provide a weekly commitment, you may be eligible to be on our dental staff. Staff dentists are provided a stipend.

Dr. Ron Heier, a longtime volunteer, states, "I first became involved at CVIM as a volunteer dentist for **Give Kids a Smile** and **Give Vets a Smile** events co-

hosted by CVIM and the Dental Society of Chester County and Delaware County. I saw firsthand how improving the oral health of children and veterans who couldn't afford care makes a difference in our community. When I sold my dental practice, I made the commitment to further help my local community by volunteering a day a week at CVIM. All patients are treated with respect and dignity, and they receive a high level of dental care. Everyone ends their visit with a "thank you" or "gracias" which reinforces how grateful they are for the care they receive. The staff at CVIM is also a joy to work with and exhibit great professionalism. Volunteering at CVIM is a benefit to the oral health of the patients and I get joy out of providing the care. It's truly a win/ win when you volunteer at CVIM."

The CVIM dental team also participates in numerous outreach events throughout the year both within and beyond the clinic. Most notable are **Give Kids a Smile** in December and **Give Vets a Smile** Day in November; these events are partnered by the Dental Society of Chester County and Delaware County. In February, CVIM hosts Sealant Saturday and Community Smiles. There are many opportunities to be involved and give back to the community, and the dental department at CVIM will make volunteering as easy as possible for you.
