Interview with Dr. Barry Cohen

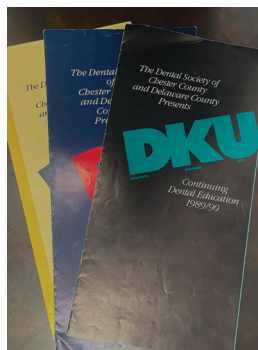


K: Tell me about your dental career.

B: I attended Penn School of Medicine and graduated in 1980. I opened a private practice in 1981 with Dr. Howells Strauss in the Fairmount section of Philly. I started my own practice in 1982 in Havertown, Delaware County. It was in the first floor of my house at the time!

K: How did you get started with DKU?

B: I originally attended a CE program called DKU offered through U Penn, given at the old 12 Caesars banquet hall on City Line Avenue. I loved the courses and the convenience of not having to go into Center City. The program was being run by Joe Greenberg, Henry Cluver and then Warren Grayboyes. In 1988, Penn dropped the program and Warren was going to end it. I enjoyed it so much, I told Warren I would love to work with him to continue the program if he could find a new partnership.



Luckily for all of us, our society stepped up and backed the new DKU program. The following year Warren moved away and the program was mine to run. My first year working with the program was the 1989-90 program. Bill Munley helped out in the early years and others have helped onsite. Over the years we had all the top names in DCE including Gordon Christensen, David Garber, Cliff Ruddle, David Hornbrook, Stanley Malamed, John Cranham, Karl Leinfelder, Harold Crossley, Dennis Tarnow, Mark Hyman, Howard Farran, Mort Amsterdam, Ross Nash, Frank Speak and John Molinari to name a few. My aim was to bring quality speakers in all aspects of dentistry to our meetings and have at least one course each series in a non clinical dental program such as business, practice management or health and nutrition.

K: Are there any interesting stories?

B: Over the years there have been quite a few! One lecture there was a snow storm that shut down the area. The only people in attendance were 10 brave dentists and the oral surgery speaker from Buffalo that got in the night before the lecture. I had to order pizza and salad for lunch and personally went out to pick it up since the country club staff didn't make it in. In another lecture we were hosting a hands-on surgery course using pig jaws. I was tasked with bringing the jaws to the hotel and when I arrived the

bottom of the box broke open and the jaws went splat all over the lobby floor! I once had a speaker go back to his room for the lunch break and fall asleep. Luckily I could tap dance until we retrieved him. And finally one time there was the piano sale in the venue we were using and they did not remove the pianos overnight. Our lecture hall was loaded with full size pianos that we had to remove before we could start the lecture.

K: What was your favorite part of DKU?

B: My favorite part of DKU was spending time with great people, lecturers and fellow attendees. My least favorite part was in the old days before computers when slides would get stuck in the projectors!

K: Is there anything that you regret or would change if you were to start all over?

B: There are some things that I would have liked to have accomplished. I would have liked to be working with another dentist that would take over the series. Maybe someone with the energy to work on attracting the younger dentists to the series. Years ago, it wasn't unusual to attract over 100 attendees each meeting. I am happy to say that our last meeting we had 90, and our May meeting is looking to go over 100! It will be good to go out with a bang.

K: Any parting words for our members?

B: I would encourage our members to continue attending the Greater Philadelphia Valley Forge meetings for free and find more in person courses to attend. To me, there are no online courses that compare to in-person live presentations for CE and the comradery that goes with it. Sadly the ADA meeting has shut down, as have many of the bigger meetings, but there are still many to attend if you like to travel. Locally, Temple and Penn still have some in person courses. It has been an honor for me to have run the DKU meetings for the Society for the last 36 years and it has given me the opportunity to work with Valley Forge and the ADA meetings. I wish all the best to our members in their CE and hope to see many of you in the April and May courses. I also like to thank all the members that have helped over the years including Harvey Wank, Jasmine Shafagh, Josh Alter and Valerie Malcolm.

The Dentists Keeping Up (DKU) continuing education series will end after the May 2026 meeting. Founded more than 40 years ago by Drs. Warren Graboyes and Stuart Isler as an extension of PENN's extramural continuing education programming, and led by Dr. Barry Cohen since 1990, the program has provided outstanding educational opportunities to the members of the Dental Society of Chester County & Delaware County. Going forward, continuing education programming will be managed by the Society's membership committee. In order to make this transition, the following amendments to the bylaws are proposed and will be voted on at the General Meeting in May 2026.

Resolved, that the bylaws be amended by deletion:
CHAPTER IV, Section 4,

- e) Establish and maintain an annual series of continuing education courses. ~~under the name Dentists Keeping Up (DKU).~~
- ~~1. Be funded by tuition paid by individual course attendees.~~
 - ~~2. Present budgetary reports at each Board of Governors meeting of the Society~~
 - ~~3. Present an annual budget to the Treasurer.~~

And be it further resolved that CHAPTER III, Section 5 be amended by deletion:

ASSISTANT TREASURER – The Assistant Treasurer shall ~~receive and deposit all monies paid to Dentists Keeping Up (DKU) and disperse the same by checks signed by the Treasurer,~~ and perform other duties as usually pertains to this office or as assigned by the Board of Governors.

The Growing Threat of AI-Driven Cyberattacks in Dental Practices

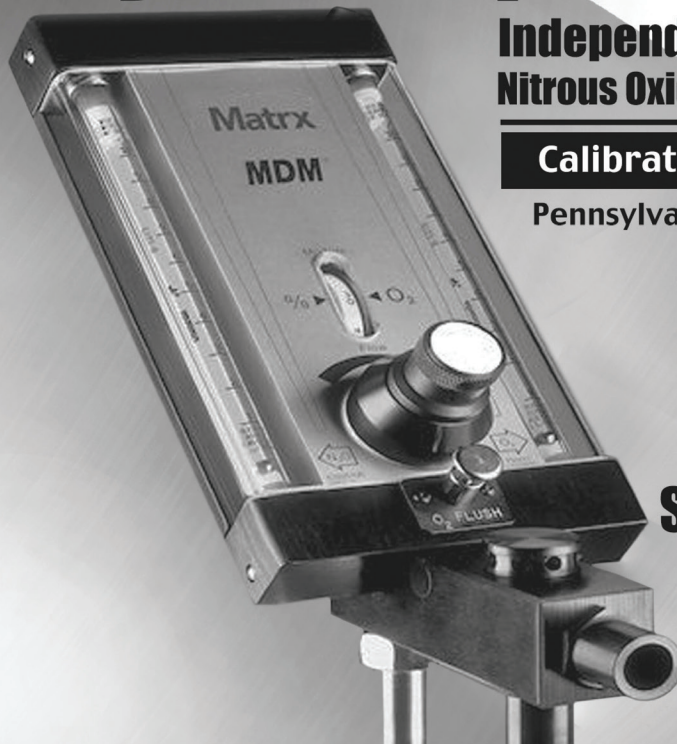
